Major finding: This is the longest, most comprehensive follow-up of thyroid cancer in the literature. It is a continuation of a study done several decades earlier at the University of Chicag. The earlier paper is the second most commonly cited paper on thyroid cancer outcomes in the literature, and we anticipate that this paper will become the new gold standard paper for long-term outcomes in thyroid cancer.
